Nadean Porter, beloved wife, mother, grandmother, and great-grandmother departed peacefully from this life the morning of June 5, 2014 at Beth Israel Hospital in Newark. She was born in Dothan, Alabama on July 1, 1937 to the late Robert and Ruby Lee Aaron.

Nadean was the oldest of eight children. She married the love of her life, Tullis Porter, Jr. on May 22, 1957, before leaving her childhood home in Dothan, Alabama in July 1959 and becoming a long time resident of Newark, New Jersey. 




