Rose was a self-employed hair stylist, fashion designer and caterer. Early in life, she began to display the virtues of hard work and getting the job done well. She had an incredible smile, loved to cook, sing, dance, read and praise God. She was a family oriented woman and she knew the Bible very well. In 1956, she attended first Haitian Baptist Church in Port- au-Prince, where she joined the Mass choir, Rose had an incredible voice, she instantly become the lead singer and she also went on to join the worship team. Later she become a Sunday school teacher, joined the children’s ministry and became an usher. She also volunteered and joined the church mission where she traveled all over Haiti to preach the word of God. Rose was amazing woman, her life was filled with joy, love and happiness. She was very funny, and always stretched out her hand to those in need and anyone unable to help them self.

Rose married Gesner Rodney in 1964. From this union three children were born, Vedette, Guitember and Darius.
