Obituary

Bessie Louise Mallisham Turner was born in Tuscaloosa, Alabama on March 22, 1922 to the late Rev. Lewis Simeon and Leola Smith Mallisham. She peacefully departed this earthly life on June 28, 2014. Bessie was the eldest daughter among five brothers and three sisters. She helped her mother by serving as a "second mother" to her siblings. Her loving care for her brothers and sisters left a big impact on them which they fondly remembered in the later years of their lives.

Bessie attended Industrial High School in Tuscaloosa and graduated in 1942. She went on to attend Stillman Institute (now called Stillman College) and was awarded a junior college diploma. She passed a test for a federal government job which led her to Washington, DC where she worked for the War Department as a stenographer. Her job allowed her to keep up with the whereabouts of her brothers and family friends serving in the armed forces during the war.

On June 20, 1948, Bessie was married to Luther P. Tuner at Fort Dix, New Jersey. To this loving union two children were born, Luther, Jr. and Gloria. The family made their home on Woodlawn Avenue in Jersey City for over two decades. She was active in the PTA while her children were in elementary school. In 1978, Bessie and Luther moved to South Orange, NJ.

Bessie was a highly skilled seamstress and her sewing skills actually began when she was young. At twelve years old, she helped her mother make a wedding dress. As her children and grandchildren were growing up, she made many of their clothes. Over the years, her skills as a seamstress benefited her church family as well. She tailored garments for church members, made Christmas program costumes and curtains for the choir loft and basement windows.

Bessie was also a great cook and baker. Anything she baked was made from "scratch." She was most known for her pound cake, pineapple upside down cake and banana pudding. And then there was her lemonade! It was always made with freshly squeezed lemons.

A loyal and faithful member of the Jersey City First Wesleyan Church for over fifty years, Bessie was loved and respected by all. Although quiet in nature, she actively served the Lord through many ministries in the local church, Women's Missionary Society, member of the Stewardship Committee, Church Teller, Tithing Secretary, Sunday School and Vacation Bible School teacher. For many years she collected Campbell Soup labels from church members in support of Hephzibah Children's Home in Macon, Georgia.

Bessie had a deep and abiding faith in God. She loved reading and studying the Bible and singing the hymns of the church. Her constancy, wisdom and smile will be remembered by all who knew her.

Bessie leaves to celebrate her life: her devoted children, Luther, Jr. (Hazel) and Gloria; her beloved grandchildren, Vanessa and Luther III; her sisters and brothers, Rev. A.L. Mallisham, James "Morgan" Mallisham, L. Rose Carter and Emma Christine Williams.
