Obituary

Edna Louise Robertson was born November 19, 1929 to Ora Ann and Osceola Smith in Wheeling, West Virginia. She departed this life on June 26, 2014 in JFK Hospital in Edison, NJ after a short illness. Edna was the youngest and the only girl of four children. Her parents and three brothers preceded her in death.

Edna attended elementary and high school in Wheeling, West Virginia. While in her junior year in high school, she had to relocate, with her mother to Vauxhall, NJ. While living in Vauxhall she attended Union High School in Union, NJ. Edna was so disheartened that her mother permitted her to return to Wheeling to live with her brother for one year, to graduate with her classmates from Lincoln High.

Edna confessed her love and belief in Jesus Christ at the age of ten. She was baptized, and united with the Macedonia Baptist Church in Wheeling.

As a young woman Edna worked at Beth Israel Hospital in Newark, NJ She met Hugh Hannah. At the age of twenty-one they married. To that union one son was born, Michael Leslie. Hugh Hannah was killed as a result of a automobile accident, leaving Edna a widow, when Michael was only nine months old.


Edna became employed with General Electric Company Lamp Division in Newark, NJ at the age of twenty-three, and remained with the company for thirty-three years. She retired when the plant closed in 1984.

Edna united with Paradise Baptist Church in 1947. This was an act of God. In 1953, while faithfully attending her Church, she met the love of her life, who also united with the Paradise Baptist Church (Walter B. Robertson). In her younger years she served as a Sunday School Teacher, and the Usher Ministry. The fourth Sunday in July 1974, Edna was appointed to the Deaconess Ministry. She was one month away from forty years of dedicated service as a Deaconess. Edna was recently honored for having the most years of service with the Church for sixty-six years of dedicated service.




