Sorrows Today Joy Tomorrow

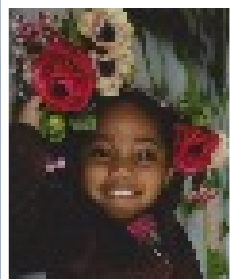
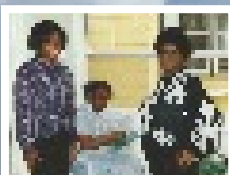
