He Loved music and was a singer and song-writer with a group in Jersey known as the Kaleidoscope. This was his passion and his heart. He was happiest when he was giving something and/or doing for others. He was a "giver".

Tommy was also a jokester. He loved playing jokes on people. He would call me and say, Hey Aunt Berna, I'm on my way to your house, about 30-minutes away Would you cook me some pork chops, rice and gravy, collard greens, and corn bread and oh, don't forget the Iced Tea with lemon. You see, I knew this was a joke because you could not get Tommy out of his zip code. Thomas Doyle Harrington was not leaving New Jersey. That's why he is being laid to rest here and not in Washington, D.C.

Tommy loved his family and his friends. He had lots and lots of friends. He had much love for his first cousins who he grew up with in New Jersey and are now living in North Carolina.....Barbara Langston-Phillips, Gloria and Maejolene Langston, and was very close to his best friend for life, Jeffrey Stewart, his special cousin, Michael Roach, and the sister he never had, Hazel Moore.

Tommy had many health challenges to include diabetes, heart and renal- illnesses. He was recently hospitalized at St. Mary's Rehabilitation Facility and discharged a few days ago. He had a way of keeping his illness to himself ...he just didn't want to share this part of his life. To have been such an entertainer and outgoing person, he actually became a loner. Tommy leaves a great memory for us, and we are: His brother, Howard Harrington, his Aunts, Maxine and Bernadette, numerous cousins, and so many friends... to name a few: Ms. Ferguson, Diane, Michael, Donald, Dana, Jeffrey, Beverly, Hazel, Ernest, Dawn, Renee, Philip, Mae, Gloria, Barbara, Robbie, Lisa, Josh, Bubby, Wolf, Michelene, Derky, Sylvia and James, Baby Erin, Baby Lita, Lloyd, Foushee, Pickles and John ... and everyone associated with Kaleidoscope. Tommy's parents Geraldine and Stacy and his baby brother Keith preceded him in death several years ago.

This is a very sad time for all of us, however, it should be a time of JOY, a time of celebrating the transition of his earthly life to his heavenly life. We seem to forget that death is a part of life. We are born into this world to die, and death is not a period, but a comma in the story of life. And life is very much like the seasons of the year:
