Paris Logan Boyd, son of the late Elvira Anderson Boyd and Edgar Leroy Boyd was born on March 26, 1947 in New York City, New York. He entered into eternal rest on August 2, 2014 at Morristown Medical Center after a brief illness.

He received his early education in the Cranford Public School system and graduated from Abraham Clark High School in Roselle, New Jersey. Paris was the first African American to be accepted in the Steamfitters Local #475 in Warren, New Jersey. He was quite proud of his accomplishment and had a strong work ethic. He believed diligence and hard work is the key to success. He acquired a part-time job as a Driver for the disabled after retirement.

Paris united with the First Baptist Church in Cranford, New Jersey under the pastorate of the Rev. Alfred E. Brown, Jr. He was married to the late Inez Camel Boyd until her passing in December 2012. They were members of the First Baptist Church in Linden until the Lord moved him back home to First Baptist Church in Cranford. He loved his church where he faithfully served on the Credit Union Board and the Trustee Ministry. He proudly sang with the Adult Choir and was always joyfully singing to the glory of God.
