Two Children Rescued From Apartment Fire

Bystanders pulled a 2-year-old to safety from a burning apartment in Northeast Washington yesterday and then saved the child's 4-year-old brother by inducing him to jump into their arms from a third-floor window, a D.C. fire official said.

Wardes Ashmon of 1724 Monroe St. NE and Glenn Jones of 600 46th Pl. SE saved Zachary Wilkerson from an apartment at 1114 21st St. NE, but were kept by intense heat from reaching the second child, according to Deputy Fire Chief Ray Alfred. From outside, however, the men saw Kenneth Wilkerson screaming at a window and persuaded him to jump, Alfred said.

The children were taken to Children's Hospital for treatment of smoke inhalation, Alfred said.
