Maxie Raoul Loncke of Elmwood Park, New Jersey, peacefully entered the Throne of Grace on August 2, 2014. "Max", as his friends and family knew him, was born on January 2, 1948, in Georgetown, Guyana, to the late Eseline and Carlton Ivor "CI" Loncke. He attended elementary school, Tutorial High, Queens College and The University in Guyana before migrating to Paterson, New Jersey in 1969. He is predeceased by his loving parents and a dear sister Lynette.

In 1969, Maxie gained employment as a teller at the First National Bank (later known as First Union) in Paterson, New Jersey. Within the first six months, he received a promotion to Head Teller and over the years he worked his way up to Branch Manager. In 2000, Max left the banking world and accepted a position in the accounting department at New Jersey Transit. He was employed there for more than thirteen years, up until the time of his death.

Max loved giving financial advice (sometimes unsolicited) and working with figures. He completed several continuing education accounting courses and was certified by the IRS as an official Tax Preparer. He represented his clients in tax audits with the IRS and was a member of the National Society of Tax Professionals. His clients adored him and it was not unusual for Max to prepare taxes pro bono for seniors on a fixed budget who needed assistance. He was a member of St. Luke Baptist Church and was involved in community activities in Paterson, Newark and Elmwood Park.

Max loved life and cherished every day that the Lord blessed him to see. He had a charismatic, magnetic personality and his presence always lit up a room. As a matter of fact, he was always the life of the party. Max "never met a stranger," and he was known for his trademark "prince charming" smile that melted hearts. Everybody he met had a "Maxie" story to tell.

In 1980, he married Jannie Williams and they shared many marital and parental experiences that taught them life lessons along the way. They loved to entertain and host gatherings with family, friends and co-workers. Max was blessed to be the father of two beautiful daughters and "PopPop" to three dynamic grandchildren. His home was always filled with the children's friends, however, Max's foremost enjoyment came from the New York Giants Football Team. He was an avid Giants fan and attended many of their home games enduring all types of weather to see his Giants play.
