Isadore never got married.

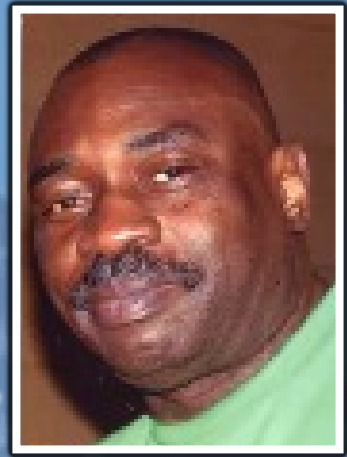
