Obituary

Mrs. Rosalie Green, wife, mother, grandmother, and great grandmother passed away quietly on the morning of August 14, 2014 at the Heritage Hall Rehabilitation Facility in Virginia Beach, Virginia. She was born in Lynchburg, South Carolina on March 21, 1926 to the late Timothy and Carrie Baker. She was the last surviving member of all of her siblings.

At an early age, Rosalie's family moved to Newark, New Jersey, where she lived most of her life. She graduated from South Side High School, met and married U.S. Army Veteran Thelman Green, their union produced one son, Anthony "Tony" Thomas Green. She accepted Jesus Christ as her Lord and Saviour and was baptized at New Hope Baptist Church in Newark in the early 1960s. For a number of years Rosalie worked as an Inspector for General Motors where she retired during the late 1980s. She took on employment at a Nursing Home for a short period of time before her diminishing health required her to move to Virginia in 2003. This was a difficult move for Rosalie because all of her close family and friends were in Newark, NJ.

A few years after moving to Virginia, Rosalie slowly began to lose her eyesight.

During her latter years, her greatest joy was to get a visit from her great-grandchildren that she affectionately nicknamed, TiTi, Bad Boy and Sherlock Holmes. They always knew that when they came to visit "GG", as they would refer to her, she would have some type of treat for them. She also looked forward to the many visits she would receive from her nephew, Chet Oxford.

Rosalie is survived by: her son, Tony Green; her three grandchildren, Obi, Cameron and Natali Green; her four great grandchildren, Tyler, Tylecia "TiTi", Noah (Bad Boy) and Treyvon (Sherlock Holmes); and a host of other relatives and friends.
