

### **Obituary**

Mrs. Rosalie Green, wife, mother, grandmother, and great grandmother passed away quietly on the morning of August 14, 2014 at the Heritage Hall Rehabilitation Facility in Virginia Beach, Virginia. She was born in Lynchburg, South Carolina on March 21, 1926 to the late Timothy and Carrie Baker. She was the last surviving member of all of her siblings.
