
































<u>Obiluary</u>

Margaret Orawford Taylor was born in Clay County, Georgia to the late Alfred and Anna Crawford on November 17, 1917 both of whom passed away at an early age. Margaret first attended school and church (Zion Hill) in Newark, NJ until her family relocated back to Georgia. Margaret was reared by her grandmother, and then by her Uncle, "Baby" and his wife, Aunt Bessie. Margaret accepted Christ at an early age.

In March 1937 she was joined in Holy Matrimony to the late Benjamin Jefferson Taylor in Clay County, GA and to this union four children were born, Janett, Faye, Benjamin Jr., and Craig Taylor.

In 1943, Margaret and "Jeff" relocated to Newark, NJ, where she first attended Trinity AME Church, then Metropolitan Baptist Church and finally made her way back to Zion Hill Baptist Church. Margaret worked as a presser by trade and was a lifelong member of the ILGU. In 1963, the ILGU participated in the March on Washington, DC and Margaret was one of the first to sign up. Margaret loved her fancy designer hats and never attended church without one. Mother was a great cook

and her children and grands loved her Bread Pudding and Sweet Potato Pies.

Margaret's greatest prayer was to raise her children into adults, having been raised by different relatives as a child. The Lord is faithful, she was granted twenty-six years plus.

Margaret departed this life on August 20th, 2014 at Whitehouse Nursing Home, Orange, NJ.

Margaret was preceded in death by her husband, Benjamin, son, Benjamin Jr., brother, Alfred Crawford, sisters, Esther Crawford and Lucille Knighton, granddaughter, Yaschica Bass and stepson, Willie James Taylor.
