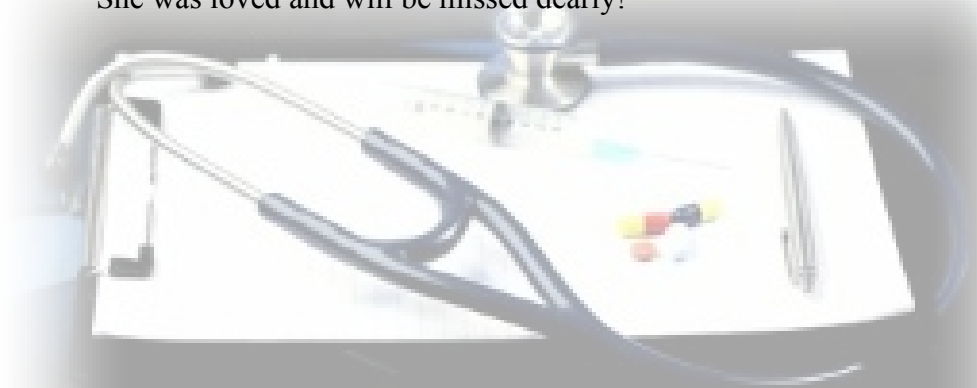
Cindy was very family-oriented and leaves a host of uncles, aunts and cousins, whom she loved dearly, and, in turn, knew they always loved her.
