

Obituary

Alexander Maloney Sr. was the middle child of three children. He was born to Lizzie Saunder and Thomas Maloney in Chester, South Carolina.

He moved to Boonton, New Jersey at the age of three and later moved to Montclair, New Jersey. He was educated in the Montclair School System and graduated in 1941. He then lived at the Montclair YMCA on Washington Street where he served as a lifeguard and a fencing instructor.

Alex served in the Navy in 1942 and was honorably discharged in 1945 after fighting in World War 11. After serving in the war, he worked in the furniture moving business then known as Shoemaker Furniture Company. His interest in furniture led him to taking a Furniture Finishing course. He later retired as head salesman at H. Brown Furniture Company in East Orange, N.J. in 1988.

He accepted Christ and was baptized at St. Paul's Church and sang in the choir.

Alex met Virginia Dare Roberts and married in November 1950. From this union, four children were born, Darlene, Tanya, Kim and Alexander Jr. Later they adopted Sylvia Hunter.

After becoming a member of the First Baptist Church of Nutley, New Jersey, he joined the Gray Panthers and the First Baptist Church Anglers' Club.

Alex looked forward to and spent most of his time playing Double Deck Pinochle, Bid Whist and Dominoes with his friends. He often reminisced about the times he enjoyed with his fishing buddies of FBC Anglers.

Alex was predeceased by his wife Virginia, two brothers, Thomas and Clarence and his daughter Sylvia. He leaves to celebrate his life, Darlene Taylor and Tanya Latimer of East Orange, N.J., Kim McAllister (Ernest) of Aylett, Virginia and Alexander Maloney Jr. of Newark, N.J., nine grandchildren, ten great-grand and one great-great grand and a host of friends and family.
