

Obituary

Percy Cornelius Yates Sr. was born to the late Douglas Yates and Edna Cole in Nash County, North Carolina on December 1, 1920. After his completion of school, the adventurous young man Percy Sr. moved to Newark, New Jersey where he met and married his first wife Eva Ardell (Walker) Yates. Through this union was born a son, John Douglas Yates, who preceded him in death. Shortly thereafter, Percy Sr. was drafted into United States Army serving overseas during World War II. While serving in the military Percy Sr. lost his first wife to illness. After being honorably discharged, he returned to Newark and found employment as a truck driver.

Shortly thereafter, he met and married his second wife of 55 years, Marion (Martin) Yates, who also preceded him in death. Through this marriage was born a son, Percy Jr. Percy Sr. and Marion settled down and raised their family which also consisted of Marilyn, a daughter from Marion's previous marriage.

Percy Sr. worked as a chemical class "A" mechanic for over 30 Years. He was employed for over 25 years with the Chemical Waste Management Company and retired from there in 1985. Percy Sr. was a man who loved working with his hands, and was often called upon by friends and family for his mechanical services. He was always ready to offer a listening ear; although he was a man of few words, when he spoke people listened. He loved sharing his life experience and often talked about growing up in the south and his tour of duty overseas. He enjoyed watching baseball and his favorite team was the New York Mets.

Percy Sr. was a God fearing man. He had a great sense of humor and never held a grudge. He was very supportive of his children. He was proud of his family and loved us very much. He was a good man and a great father.

Percy Sr. departed this life peacefully on September 19, 2014 at Lyons Veteran's Hospital. He leaves to cherish his memory one daughter, Marilyn Hill, one son Percy Yates Jr., son-in-law, Fletcher Hill, two sisters-in-laws, Catherine Yates, Laura Ryals and one brother-law James Debose Sr. His cherished grandchildren are Linda, Terrence, Darren, Troy, Tylean, Tonya, Taigi, Nafessa and Jamel.
