Life's Story

Betty Afotey, the second of three children was born on July 15, 1955 to Theresa and Benoni Afotey Odai in Labadi- Accra, Ghana. Betty attended Presbyterian Primary School at Nsawam, Ghana. Betty had a wonderful childhood during the late 50's into the late 60's.

Betty attended Akropong Girls Boarding School with her sister, Joyce and continued after graduation to Mfantseman Secondary School at Saltpond, Ghana, where she graduated in 1976. After graduation from secondary school, Betty was employed by the Social Security and National Insurance Trust (SSNIT) in Accra, Ghana, and embarked on a career in government service where she served honorably. Betty loved to travel, so after a few years in public service, she spent some time in London. On April 22, 1980, God blessed Betty with the love of her life, her beautiful daughter, Princess Sowah. Then on October 12, 1985 God blessed Betty with her heart, her son, her King, Nii Odoi Sowah. After the birth of her son Nii, Betty wanted to improve her career and better support her family, so she decided to join her husband, Francis Sowah in the U.S. Betty then relocated to Newark, NJ to start a new life. Like her mother, who was a mid-wife for Ministry of Health in Ghana, Betty chose healthcare as her vocation when she came to America. This was mainly driven by her boundless love for others and her caring nature. She realized that America is a place full of challenges as well as opportunities and she did her best to provide for her family and loved ones. Betty took nursing classes at Essex County College as she worked at Newark Beth Israel and Saint Barnabas Medical Center. In 1998, Betty was employed as a caregiver to Barbara Yoskowitz of West Orange, NJ. For the sixteen years that followed, she provided outstanding service for her patient and loved Barbara Yosokwitz and her family.

On August 25, 2010, God called Betty's son home. The sudden and tragic death of Nii left Betty so heart broken. But Betty being the strong woman we all knew her to be, kept on for her daughter, Princess and granddaughter, Chole. Betty enjoyed life to the fullest maintaining a lively smile and energetic presence that could light up the dullest room. Betty was passionate at everything she did and her actions came straight from her heart. In her down time, Betty loved to shop, **AND YES, SHE HAD EXPENSIVE TASTE.** Betty loved spending time with her daughter, Princess and her granddaughter, Chloe. Betty always opened her heart and home to any and everyone. All of her nieces, nephews, Nii and Princess's friends all knew "Betty" affectionately as "Auntie Betty!"

On Wednesday, August 27, 2014 Betty was called home to glory to be with her Lord and Savior. The news came so unexpectedly and has dealt a devastating blow to the entire family. Her departure leaves us so saddened, but we are encouraged by the words of Isaiah 57:1-2 which reads "The righteous perish, and no one takes it to heart; the devout are taken away, and no one understands that the righteous are taken away to be spared from evil. Those who walk uprightly enter into peace; the find rest as they lie in death."
