She later joined Calvary Temple in Linden under the pastorship of the late Pastor Alfred Jeffery and Pastor Bobbie Dean Smith. She found a home at the Refreshing Springs Community Tabernacle UHC in Newark under her pastor whom she loved dearly. She worked diligently on the church's Mother, Missionary and Nursing Boards.

In 1961, she met and married Mack Butler. They were blessed with two children: Kevin and Kimberly Butler.

Mother Butler started her career as a Registered Nurse at Beth Israel Medical Center in Newark. After many years of dedicated service, she worked in the same capacity at Clara Maass Medical Center in Belleville, retiring in 1981.
