<u>Obituary</u>

Queen Odessa Jenkins the daughter of Georgia and John T. Hall was born on March 17, 1929 in Haddock, GA. Odessa was one of five siblings, and was a graduate of Grey High School. She was active during the Civil Rights movement and politics. Queen Odessa came to New Jersey to reside with her aunt, Nellie Harris in 1949.

She married Clarence D. Jenkins (Chinkie) and from their union two daughters were born, Valerie and Clarise Jenkins. Upon the death of her husband, Clarence Jenkins, she later in life met her long time companion, Lorenzo Outerbridge until his death.

Queen Odessa fellowshipped at St. Marks AME Church located on Stirling St., Newark, NJ and then transferred her fellowship to Messiah Baptist Church in the early 70's, she was a member of the Usher Board.

Queen worked for F.W. Woolworths, McCorys and switched to child care at Friendly Fuid Day Care and Precious Little Day Care both in Newark, NJ.

Known by her family as "Odessa", she will be missed by all who may have had the pleasure of knowing her.
