The Alpha and the Omega of Anselina (Savery) Sinclair

Anselina Icilyn (Savery) Sinclair also commonly known by her pet name of “**Punce**” or just plain “**Aunty P**” was born the 19th of September in the year 1930 to Maud McKenzie and Logan Savery in Bamboo, Saint Ann, Jamaica. She was the fourth of five children. She attended the local school where she graduated from.

Finding it very difficult to find employment in Bamboo, Anselina relocated to Kingston to find work where she met her first love. Marriage did not ensue, but a son was the product of that relationship. Anselina was left to bring up her son with help from her mother and sisters. She left her son behind in Bamboo to look for work again in Kingston where she found work at the Creamo Factory in Kingston. She worked there for a number of years until she was able to find another job with an increased salary in Downtown, Kingston as a messenger.

During this time she met her husband and had her daughter, Lola commonly known as (Vivienne) by her family and friends. Her eldest sister, Hazel migrated to the United States some years before her and settled in the Bronx, New York in the late 60s. Hazel offered her the opportunity to migrate to the United States which she joyfully accepted and settled in the Bronx too. She worked in a department store until it closed down and was fortunate to find alternative work at Astor Garden Nursing Home as a dietary aide where she worked until retirement.

Anselina has always grieved the loss of her sister Hazel. They would call each other sometimes three or four times per day. If a message was given to one, by the time you called the other you would hear “yes your mother, or yes your auntie told me.” During her retirement she kept herself busy taking care of her home, and helping to raise her two grandsons who lived with her. She was always very concerned about the well being of others.

She is survived by her daughter, Lola, son, Aeon Sr., and daughter-in-law, Sharon, grand-children, Kerry Anne, Aeon Jr., Sharlene, Christopher, Peter and Christian.
