Life Reflections

Dr. Charles Watson, born on April 30, 1951 in Elizabeth, New Jersey was the second child of Marion and the late Wilhelmay Watson. He transitioned from this life to everlasting life on Saturday, October 18, 2014 in Elizabeth, New Jersey.

Charles was educated at an early age through the Elizabeth Public School System. In 1968, the family moved to Linden, New Jersey where he completed his education at Linden High School.

Charles completed his undergraduate studies at New York University (NYU) and obtained a Bachelors Degree in Accounting. He received various accreditations and certifications from Somerset Christian College (Pillar College), Drake College of Business and Union County College.

He pursued various skilled occupations such as a Finance Auditor, Finance Administrator and Substitute Teacher for the Elizabeth Board of Education.

Mr. Watson was a faithful member of the First Baptist Church of Kenilworth, New Jersey. He later came to fellowship at Grace Divine Church of Christ in Linden, New Jersey where he served as a Bible Study Teacher and as a committed outreach worker.

His love for the Word of God, and passion for service inspired him to further his education. He attended Christian Bible Institute College, where he earned a Secondary Bachelors Degree in Theology. Charles completed post-graduate courses at the Eastern Bible School of Theology Seminary (North Carolina) where he earned a PHD.

Charles (affectionately known by family as “Chucky”) leaves to celebrate his life, his father, Marion Watson of Linden, NJ; three sisters, Lorraine Watson McGriff (Tommy McGriff, Sr.) of Roselle, NJ, Emma Jean Watson of East Orange, NJ and Loretta Watson of Linden, NJ.

In addition, a brother-in-law, George Howe, Jr. of Newark, NJ; one godson, Dwight Wright; two goddaughters, Vanessa and Valarie Beeks and a host of aunts, uncles, nieces, nephews, family and friends.

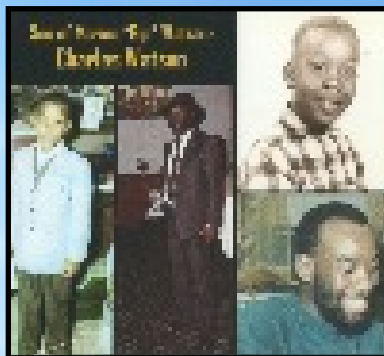
