Reflections of Life

Pastor Laurice Taylor entered into the joy of eternal life with the Lord on Wednesday, November 12, 2014 at the age of 72.

Pastor Taylor was the fourth eldest of eight children born to the late Lawrence and Lue Taylor on September 11, 1942 in Halifax County, North Carolina. She was educated through the Pea Hill Public School system in Halifax County.

In 1963, Pastor Taylor re-located to Paterson, New Jersey where she was employed at Spotless Cleaners for many years. She then began her nursing career at Lincoln Park Nursing Home Lincoln Park, NJ. While employed at Lincoln Park, she continued her education and received her certification as an EKG Technician. Pastor Taylor then embarked on her new career at Kessler Institute for Rehabilitation in Saddle Brook, NJ from which she later retired.

Pastor Taylor had a loving and humble heart of gold. She was a strong, powerful and outstanding woman, mother and Pastor who loved the Lord. Her Christian journey began as a youth at the Righteous Grove Baptist Church in Enfield, NC where she was a faithful Usher. After establishing herself in Paterson, NJ, Pastor Taylor attended the Community Baptist Church of Love for many years. She later became a member of the Paterson Evangelistic Center under the guidance of Apostle Willie S. Darden, where Christ entered her life. Pastor Taylor later joined the Light of Hope Church where she became an evangelist. She continued her evangelistic endeavors at Mount Sinai Church in the Bronx, NY under the leadership of the late Pastor Dorothy M. Ross. Pastor Taylor's most fruitful accomplishment came on

June 11, 2006 when she became pastor of the Mount Sinai Church, Inc. Bronx, NY

Pastor Laurice Taylor was predeceased by four brothers, Lawrence Taylor, Jr., George Earl Taylor, Charles Taylor and Elder Sidney Taylor.
