Xatrina Elizabeth Cuggle was born on November 21, 1926 in Keysville, Virginia to the late Ernest Williams and Rosa G. Bryant. She grew up on a 40 acre farm with her three siblings, Theresa, Ellwood and Margery. At an early age, Katrina was baptized at the Antioch Baptist Church in Keysville, Virginia. She received her formal education at the Lunenberg County schools of Virginia.

In 1944, Katrina moved to New York and worked in the catering business in Westchester County with her two aunts, Beatrice Smith and Grace Lucas. While working full time at Grasslands Hospital in Valhalla, Katrina met Eugene Tuggle. On May 22, 1948, Katrina and Eugene were married in holy matrimony by the late Reverend Louis W. Hughes D.D. To their union two children were born, Earnest Tuggle and Rodney Tuggle. In 1963, a job opening became available at New York Telephone and Katrina accepted the new challenge.

As a member of Union Baptist Church, Katrina was active as a Sunday school teacher, an Usher and on various auxiliaries. By the leading of the Holy Spirit, Katrina helped form the Union Temple Inspirational Church (The Prayer Palace) in Greenburgh, New York under the leadership of Pastor Charles H. Churn. There she served as a missionary, Deaconess and Trustee. In the early 1980's she was appointed religious instructor and on the Board of Religious Education at Union Temple Inspirational Church. In December 2000, Katrina rededicated her life as a servant at Union Baptist Church of Greenburgh, New York. She continued to faithfully serve and attended Union Baptist Church for many years.

\*\*Xatrina\*\* had a passion for knitting and she made the most beautiful patchwork quilts. She loved cooking good food in her home and her Thanksgiving dinners were the best in town! People would travel miles to taste her cooking. After providing 26 years of service at the New York Telephone Company, Katrina retired from NYNEX in 1989. During her retirement, she traveled around the world to various places with her baby sister, Margery. Katrina's senior years were highlighted every 1st Sunday by receiving communion from the visiting Deacons of Union Baptist Church and every Tuesday at 1:00 p.m. sharp playing BINGO.

Xatrina was a faithful Woman of God who gave unselfishly of her time and talents. The beauty of her kindness will always be an inspiration to all who knew her - family as well as friends. She left many fine qualities for us to emulate. Her kind heart, her generosity, her peaceful attitude, her abiding faith, her keen sense of humor, her willingness to never complain and always lend a helping hand are amongst our most cherished memories.
