Gerald Jerome St. Clair was born on May 9, 1952, in the Bronx, New York to the late Michael and Margaret St. Clair. He was the second of six children from this loving union.

Gerald attended the New York City Public School System and graduated from William Howard Taft High School. He went on to get his Associate's degree from Bronx Community College in January 1980, then received his Bachelor of Arts from John Jay College of Criminal Justice in New York City in June 1981. In between these events he was blessed with a beautiful daughter in December 1973, Victoria Winifred, who he loved dearly.

In June 1974, he joined the New York City Police Department as a patrolman, then he was assigned as an investigator to the Detective's Bureau of the Bronx Homicide Task Force in April 1992. Shortly thereafter Gerald was promoted to the Rank of Detective 2nd Grade.

After 23 years of dedicated service, he retired in July 1997. Throughout those 23 years, he formed several friendships, many of which he remained in contact with. After being retired for one year he excepted a position as Corporate Loss Prevention Associate with Polo Ralph Lauren's in New York City. He remained there for eight years, where he formed many friendships.

One of his favorite pastimes was watching a good Western or any number of old movies on the Turner Classic channel. And of course he loved a good meal.

He attended the St. Luke Baptist Church in the Village of Harlem where the Rev. Dr. J.G. McCann is pastor.
