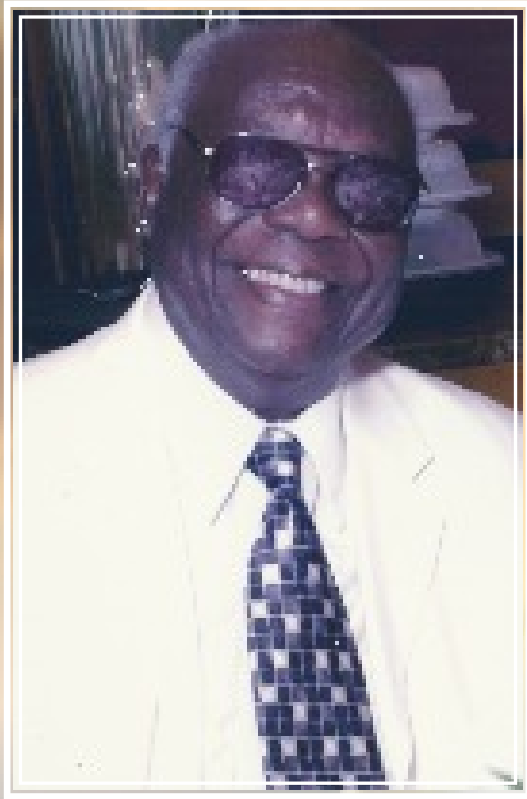

Obituary

Arthur Singleton was born on September 3, 1922 in Beaufort, South Carolina. He was the son of Ed and Sarah Singleton.

Arthur was educated at Robert Small High School in Beaufort, South Carolina. As a young man, he moved to Elizabeth, NJ where he lived with the late Arthur and Bessie Singleton. During his time in Elizabeth, he enlisted into the US Army. He was discharged October 29, 1946.

Arthur met and married his soul mate, Adeline Singleton, after returning to Elizabeth, NJ. They were united for sixty-seven years until God called him home.

Arthur started working for the Pennsylvania Railroad in New York City. He retired from that career and began a new career working for the Newark Board of Education, and he retired from that job.

Arthur joined Israel Memorial AME Church in Newark, NJ in the 1940s. He was a steward for over thirty years, a member of the Men's Choir, and a faithful member of the Sunday school. God gave Arthur the gift of prayer. Anyone who heard him would agree. His words of wisdom and knowledge of the Bible were inspirational. He was proud to tell people he read the entire Bible three times.

Arthur was preceded in death by his brother, the late Dan Singleton.
