

<u>Obiluary</u>

Marie Ange Brazela was born in Port de Paix, Haiti on July 25th 1943. She was the third daughter and the fourth child of Helene, (nee Canton) and Demosthenes Brazela. Marie Ange was raised in a home full of laughter and love by her parents. Marie Ange grew up surrounded by eight siblings, one can only imagine the joy and mischief within the walls of that house. Marie Ange was educated at Les Filles de la sagesse in Port de Paix. As a teenager Marie Ange suffered a serious injury which caused her to drop out of school. Her injury was severe, she fell into a coma, her family didn't believe she would survive. The prayers of her family and a miracle of God helped Marie Ange pull through. Marie Ange not only survived, she thrived. Although she wasn't able to continue her education, she carried all her life a very strong interest in education. She was drawn to "commerce", as the Haitians call it.

In 1963, Marie Ange met Harry J. Desrouleaux, fell in love and got married. They had four children. Harry Jr., Katiana, Jimmy and Mackenzie. Jimmy died at an early age. The loss of her child affected Marie Ange greatly. The Desrouleaux family lived in Carrefour. Marie Ange started a business selling various goods out of her house. Her work didn't stop her from providing guidance, structure, discipline and love to her children. She also cared for her nieces and nephews since the Desrouleaux's lived in an extended household.

In 1978, the family immigrated to the United States. They arrived in Irvington, NJ in the Spring of that year. The family was welcomed by the Ambroise family, Emile and Maryse (Harry's sister) took them in and helped acclimate them to the US. Marie Ange found work at Rizla where she worked the assembly line. She worked at Rizla for ten years. After leaving Rizla, Marie Ange went to work for Revlon where she stayed until she retired.

Marie Ange was a very caring person. She made friends where ever she went. While at Rizla she met numerous coworkers who became lifelong friends. That was also true at Revlon. Mary Ange loved helping her friends. Whatever she had was yours if you needed it. As her friend Marie Ange wanted to know how you were doing, if there was anything she could help you with. She enjoyed interacting with family and friends, she would spend hours on the phone with distant relatives. Mary Ange had many dimensions, she loved her family, loved church, loved her friends and loved Tropicana. She also had a great sense of humor, laughter was always present. Upon walking into her house she would offer you food. If none was ready she would cook it, all the while telling you stories and laughing harder than anybody else in the room. Losing her is a great loss for all who have known her.

On November 27, 2014, after a brave and valiant battle with diabetes and heart disease, Marie Ange was called to heaven by God. She was called to join her mother, her father, her brother, Jean Rollet, her brother, Laveau, her brother, Eden, her brother, Herard and her sister, Marie Edele. Marie Ange, our prayers are with you. Our memories of you will never fade. You live on in your children, your grandchildren, your family and your friends. You live on in all you have touched.
