Though Sharon has made her transition to the heavens above, it is certain she said to the angels the night she arrived, "Turn down for what?"


Just as New York City has never been the same since her arrival, heaven is in for someone special.


Sharon was preceded in death by her parents, and her brothers, Ferdinand, Elonis Joe (affectionately known as "Cups"), and Oliver Wells.


