Obituary

On Tuesday, December 9, 2014, **Alfonza Jackson, Sr.** entered into eternal rest in Brandywine, Maryland.

Alfonza, the son of the late Irene Walker and Brown Jackson, was born May 12, 1936 in Montgomery, Alabama, and received his formal education at Lovely Elementary School and Bellenger High School. While at Bellenger High School, he led the Marching Band during parades. After leaving school, he became a professional painter and moved to Daleville, Alabama, and worked at the Fort Ricker Company Club. While there, he befriended a co-worker named Jessie Williams, who introduced him to his sister named Birtha Mae Williams. On April 1, 1964 Alfonza and Birtha entered into holy matrimony and relocated to Orange, New Jersey.

Alfonza began work at the Marbourgh Hotel in East Orange, New Jersey where he met Mother Earlene Brown, who often talked to him about the Lord and "being saved". He recalled trying to hide from Mother Brown, but she would always find and invite him to Zion Pentecostal Faith Church. Eventually, Alfonza began attending services at Zion Pentecostal Faith Church, where he was "Saved" and became the God-Son of Mother Brown. Alfonza was a faithful servant of Zion and served as an Usher, Deacon and Painter.

Alfonza enjoyed spending time with his family, talking with friends at local coffee shops and fellowshipping with the "Saints" of Zion.

In 2002, Alfonza retired from Selecto Flash and Daughter's of Israel in West Orange, New Jersey and later relocated to Brandywine, Maryland.
