

Obituary

Cynthia "loveable C.C." Taylor was born on December 15, 1962 in Harlem Hospital to Gloria Lewis (Deceased) and Father Robert Taylor Sr. (Deceased). She was the 4th of 7 children. Around 1965 the family moved from Harlem, N.Y. to Manhattan's lower west side. She attended PS 11 Elementary and IS 70 Intermediate School. There she got her first nickname, "Shrimp-o-mighty". Although Cynthia was a little thing, she was also a tomboy and really liked doing all the things her brothers did. Upon her Father's passing, in 1977, she, her sister Kathy and brother Alan moved to (LA) Laurelton in Queens, N.Y. where they lived with their aunt and uncle. Cynthia attended Springfield Gardens H.S. It was in Queens that her passion for music took hold and started to grow. Cynthia was taught, by her brother Alan, how to 'MC' and 'Rock the Turntables'. Together along with their cousins they started a DJ group called T-Production Crew. Cynthia also formed the first female rap group with four friends called the "Force of the Four Mcs". They were very successful in Queens and because Cynthia could do it all, people came to see the female DJ and MC, now called "CC". They played at many house parties, in the parks and Centers all over, even starting some events in Queens that continue until this day.

Cynthia moved to the Bronx with her sister in the early eighty's and her music passion flourished. Her brother Alan eventually moved there too and once again they were a dynamic duo. They formed T-Production2 Crew with "Loveable CC" and new artists; once again along with their friends becoming a top Drawing Group, this time in the Boogie down Bronx. Throughout her music journey she met, watched, schooled and nurtured many artists and friends, a lot of whom are here with us today. Cynthia stayed in the Bronx, working for the State of NY at a facility for functional adults and also for the Icon Copy Company. She had a daughter, Ashley Barbee, and for a while it was truly Ashley and Cynthia against the world. Later she had a son, Aron who rounded out their family.

As many of you know, Cynthia had ups and downs in her life which sometimes sent her down a dark path, but through it all, it was her love of music and family that kept her going.

Cynthia is survived by her daughter, Ashley; son, Aron; granddaughter, Marley; sister, Kathy; brother, Alan (Alan T); brother, Rob (Master Robb); sister, Tanya; brother, Mike and a host of nieces, nephews, cousins and extended family and friends who loved her dearly.

On November 27, 2014 Cynthia left this plane to play music on another. Now she will put on the show she always wanted to play but for the Lord and the family she is with above. We all love her and will miss her dearly.
