Deaconess Mary E. Huff was the second of twelve children (eleven daughters and one son) born to the late Bertie Murray and Lizzie Judge-Murray on March 16, 1928 in Russellville, South Carolina where she completed high school and graduated from the Russellville School System. She was also baptized at an early age in the Day Dawn Baptist Church, of Pineville, South Carolina.

Realizing that there was more to life than farm work, she went north to Washington, D.C. to join her sister, Estelle. After working there for a few years, Mary later migrated, at the request of the late Mrs. Francis Rucker, to Rahway, New Jersey in 1957, where she met and married the love of her life, the late Deacon Van B. Huff. To that union three daughters were born, Lisa, Vanessa and Robin M. Huff. Furthering her Christian journey, Mary received the Right Hand of Fellowship by Rev. Dr. Paul McDaniel, who was at that time the Pastor of Second Baptist Church Rahway. Through the years, Mary was an active participant in the Second Baptist Church family and diligently worked in varying church organizations including the Deaconess Board and the Emergency Choir.

In the mid-1960's, Mary was a childcare provider in her home, and had a basement full of children (including Deacon Larry Young). Working parents knew that under Mary's care, their children were safe, well fed and obedient. In later years, she worked at Jan's Fashions and Hershey Imports both of Rahway. Mary, whose home was spotless, was

frequently called upon to work with and supervise the wait staff for small private parties for the Rodman and Goldman families of Colonia, and the caterer Johnnie Calland of Avenel.

Mary was also a devoted wife, who was loved for her down home style of cooking almost every holiday she could be found in the kitchen putting her "spin" on family meal favorites such as fried fish, cornbread, biscuits with homemade peach preserves, whipped candied yams topped



with marshmallow's, fried corn, and of course her smothered chicken with rice. She brought southern hospitality to her Rahway family and friends and many who came through the door around dinner time left with a sense of satisfaction and love.
