Wilma Lucile Freeman Pressley passed from this life to the next on Saturday, January 3, 2015 after a protracted battle with Alzheimer's.

Lucile was born on June 26, 1922 to Maggie Latta Freeman and Remus Freeman in McConnells, South Carolina. Lucille was the youngest and last remaining of seven children; brothers J.P., Vincent Louis, and Amzie and sister and lifelong best friend Bessy Beatrice as well as two sisters who died in infancy.

At age twenty-four, Lucile left South Carolina to join her sister, Bea in Montclair, New Jersey after attending teacher's college. There she met the brother of her brother-in-law, handsome Army veteran, John Pressley. The two fell in love, and married on November 30, 1946. The couple raised five wonderful children over the course of their loving 55-year marriage, ending with John's death in 2001.

In the late 1940's, the family moved to Newark, New Jersey. In 1961 Lucile joined the Mount Pleasant Missionary Baptist Church family where she was an active member involved in many of the outreach initiatives of the church. Lucile was a member of the Nurse's Ministry, the Prevailing Prayer Band which brings comfort to the sick and shut-in, the Seniors Choir and the Pastor's Aide. Lucile served as a cook in the church kitchen and as a Sunday School teacher; but no post brought her as much joy as serving with the Christian Fellowship Association Women's Department where she helped plan the State and National conventions.

Lucile also spread her good works throughout the community through the Eastern Star organization, Martha Chapter #6, where she served on all of the Five Points and a two year term as Worthy Matron 1970-1971. Lucile worked with her Eastern Star sisters for nearly twenty years until family obligations prevented her from devoting so much time outside the home. With all that Lucile did in the Church and the larger community, no one received as much loving kindness, true fellowship and sage advice as her family.

Lucile was predeceased by her parents, brothers and sisters, two daughters, Maggie and Ruthie Odessa and a grandchild, Sierra.

Lucile is lovingly remembered by her five children, Dennis Spencer Freeman, Teresa Sanders, Arline Fisher, Douglas Pressley and Derek Pressley and her niece Bertha Paden. Lucile lives on through her 11 remaining grandchildren, 12 great-grandchildren and four great, great-grandchildren.

Despite the debilitating illness that ended her life, Lucile's 92 years here on Earth left a positive impact on the lives of all her family and friends and she will be sorely missed.
