<u>Obituary</u>

Charles Thomas was born and raised in Tampa, Florida to the late Charlie and Fannie Elizabeth Thomas on July 26, 1932.

Charles was educated and lived the early part of his life in Tampa, Florida. Charles began his career as a Life Guard for the Dade County Park and Recreation where he was a Swimming Instructor for three schools in Florida. While pursuing his career in Florida, he was drafted by the United States Army. He proudly accepted the challenge of serving his country. During his years in the army, he served in the Korean War and was held as a Prisoner of War for 2 years. Charles received the National Defense Service Medal, the United National Service Medal, the Korean Service Medal and the Bronze Service Star.

Charles met and married Geraldine, his devoted partner, in July, 1954. They have been married for 60 years. The two were always seen together serving jointly on the Senior Ushers' Ministry of Solid Rock Baptist Church.

In recognition of his devotion to the church and his outstanding Christian attributes, he was ordained a Deacon at Solid Rock Baptist Church on February 16, 1997. Deacon Thomas along with his wife Geraldine proudly served on the Deacon/Deaconess Ministry since his ordination.

Deacon Thomas served as President of the Ushers' Ministry for many years and as an Advisor to the Baptist Ushers' Union of Newark and Vicinity.

Deacon Thomas who was a founding member of Solid Rock Baptist Church has always been a faithful servant of God. He was devoted to his church and worked day and night ensuring the upkeep of the facility until he was physically unable able to serve. During his many years serving, he proudly took on the job of Van Driver and made sure that his church family was able to attend Bible Study, Sunday Worship Services and any outings attended in support of the church ministry.

Deacon Thomas leaves to mourn his death, his wife Geraldine, a daughter, Connie Hall and three grandchildren, a host of nieces, nephews, cousins, relatives and his church family.

Deacon Thomas was preceded in death by six brothers and two sisters.
