Rev. Ronald Alfred Green, Sr. was born on April 9, 1951 in Mead, West Virginia, son of the late Mr. Samuel Green, Sr. and Mrs. Mildred Green. He graduated from Stoco High School. His early Christian training was at St. Paul Baptist Church in Mead, West Virginia during that time he served as the Superintendent of Sunday school.

In 1976, Rev. Green was ordained as a Deacon and served on the board at Greater Mt. Moriah Baptist Church. He received the call to the ministry and was ordained in 1978 under the leadership of Rev. M. L. Frazier. He continued to study the word. He matriculated at the Northern Baptist School of Religion and Manhattan Bible Institute, receiving a Bachelor of Theology Degree.


