Ulysses Scott was born in Georgetown, Georgia on April 6, 1948 to the late James Homer and Susie Mae Scott and was the youngest of eight siblings. Ulysses departed this life on January 6, 2015 at Beth Israel Hospital in Newark, NJ.

At an early age, Ulysses joined Davis Chapel AME Church in Georgetown, GA. Ulysses began his education at the Kaigler Training School in Georgetown, GA.
