**Dewey Johnson Jr.**, 89, passed away peacefully on January 11, 2015 at the JFK Hartwyck at Cedar Brook Nursing Home in Plainfield, NJ. Some of his favorite past times was to listen to music, sit on his patio, sip iced tea and watch the comings and goings around him. He liked to joke, eat a good meal and spend time with his family.

Dewey will be greatly missed. He leaves to mourn his passing five children, Dewey III and his wife Rita, Olivia, Karen, Deborah and Kimberly, seven grandchildren, five great grandchildren and a host of nieces, nephews and loved ones.
