Obituary

Roland Hayes Byers was born on August 18, 1930, in Cherryville, NC. He was named for the great African-American classical, opera tenor and composer. Roland was the youngest of the six children born to Hood E. Byers and Vivian (Erwin) Byers. During the depression, his parents brought the family out of the oppression of the South to Washington, DC.

Roland enlisted in the Air Force in 1950 and married Ethel Grace Purnell in 1953. The couple ended their marriage in 1978.

His twenty year military career took him to many places, including Korea, Saudi Arabia, Europe and, during the Vietnam War, Taiwan, and several stateside air bases.

After retiring from the service, Roland worked as a sales representative for the Heublein Corporation in Connecticut and as a regional sales manager for the company in Indiana. He also earned an associate degree in criminal justice around that time. He went on to make his home in New Jersey and served for several years as a criminal investigator for Essex County.

Roland was at heart a musician, singing and playing the piano, as his mother had, at home and in performance groups. His life was enriched by the music he loved, particularly jazz and early gospel. He was an avid lifelong fan of Nat King Cole, Errol Garner and Oscar Perterson.

He was also a talented writer, having won short-story competitions while in the military, and he worked over the years on an unpublished novel based on his life.

Roland passed away at age 84 on January 3, 2015, in Orange, NJ, after a recurrence of cancer. He leaves behind: his daughter, Cassandra Byers Harvin; grandsons, Alexander and Avery Byers Harvin, all of Jersey City; his sister, Betty Smith of Silver Spring, MD; his companion, Lestelle Riddick; his dear friend, Dorothy Brown-Taylor; eight nieces and nephews. His siblings, Wade Byers, Arnold Byers, Thelma Harris and Bill Byers predeceased him.
