<u>Obituary</u>

Pauline "Dee" Sanders was born October 24, 1920, to the union of the late Hayes and Hettie Sanders of Borden, South Carolina. Pauline was educated in the Rembert, South Carolina school system, along with six sisters and eleven brothers.

Pauline married Stoney Herrington, Sr. of Rembert, South Carolina, in 1940, and from this union four children were born, Irene Herrington (Glover), Levenia Herrington (Hartman), Stoney Herrington, Jr. and Gladys Herrington. Unfortunately, her husband, Stoney, Sr., and two daughters, Gladys, and Levenia (Vennie) preceded her in death.

Stoney and Pauline moved from Rembert, South Carolina to New York City, New York in 1940, when he was drafted in the US Army, and served in World War II. They continued to live in New York City, until their deaths.

Pauline was a homemaker, raising her children without babysitters, but with the support of family and friends.

Pauline was one of the first members of Bethany Baptist Church congregation, joining in 1945, under the leadership of Rev. Henry Brooks, Sr., where she worshipped until she became unable to attend in 2013. Pauline was a Christian woman who loved her church family.

Pauline was called to rest, Saturday, January 17, 2015, at the Jewish Home Lifecare in New York City, NY.

She leaves to cherish her fond memories: one daughter, Irene; one son, Stoney, Jr.; three grandchildren, Solomon Glover of Newport News, VA, Shelly Hartman Goddard of Amityville, LI and Sherise Hartman Harris of Atlanta, GA; two grandsons-in-law, Thomas Goddard and Calrico Harris; three great grandsons, Dashaun Glover, Julius Goddard and Myles Goddard; one brother, Walter Sanders of Borden, SC; one sister, Sally Tarvor of Columbus, Ohio; three sisters-in-law, Susie Williams of Rembert, SC, Mary Sanders of Rembert, SC and Lannie Herrington of Philadelphia, PA.
