<u> Obituary</u>

Eric Noel Morrison was born on December 16, 1963 in Newark, NJ to Beatrice Morrison and the late Millard F. Morrison. He is preceded in death by his sister, the late Olivia Morrison and by his brothers, the late Carl Knight Morrison and the late Victor Morrison.

Known for his gentle manner and his love of all forms of music, Eric was a product of the Newark Public School system and graduated from Arts High School. His formal education continued, attending Upsala College graduating with a BA degree in Business Administration in 1985. During his college years, Eric was a member of the Upsala Chamber Singers and Upsala Gospel Choir and was known for having a resoundingly resonant bass voice. He demonstrated his passion for helping others through his participation as a mentor in *Workshop 90* while at Upsala. In addition, Eric was a Student Ambassador advocating for students' rights and also served as a member of the Third World Student Organization, an organization ensuring minority representation in student life affairs. Lastly, he was an Educational Opportunity Fund (EOF) Counselor assisting incoming students with the necessary lifestyle adjustments for successful college life.

After graduation, Eric held a succession of mortgage banking positions for 21 years with various financial institutions including: Howard Savings Bank, First Fidelity Bank, First Union, SIB Mortgage Company, Lehman Brothers and Franklin Credit Management Corporation. In each instance, Eric combined his knowledge of the mortgage banking industry with his compassion to help hundreds of underserved customers. His love for mortgage banking was remarkable.


Even more remarkable was Eric's love for children. One of his last positions was that of Operations Manager for Not Just a Daycare, a childcare facility in Roselle, NJ. Eric was drawn to the infants and they sought him out for the sensitive way in which he interacted with them continuously engaging them. His connection with children carried over into his personal life as he established and maintained very, very close relationships with his niece, nephews and godchildren.

Born into a family of musicians, Eric was passionate about all types of music. He was a fan of club and house music and jazz and in particular, loved the music of Sarah Vaughan and Diane Reeves. In addition, Eric enjoyed African American spirituals among other genres. His interest in music was brilliantly exemplified through his loyal membership in the North Jersey Philharmonic Glee Club until his health prevented his participation. Moreover, Eric also sang with the Thurston G. Frazier Memorial Chorale of The Gospel Music Workshop of America, The Hampton University Ministers Conference Choir and The National Baptist Convention USA, Inc. Music Auxiliary.

Without question, Eric's love for music was upstaged by his love of his family. The influential women who shared in Eric's life and who he dearly loved were: his late grandmother, Rosa Lee Hollis, his mother, Beatrice Morrison and his Aunt Topsy (Yvonne Hollis) He diligently cared for them and attended to their every need.
