Obituary

The Life and Legacy of Delores Marie Lyons Howington Boothe

Delores was the first of 5 children born to the late Florine Lyons Carlisle of Whitakers, NC and the late William Dancy of Poughkeepsie, NY on January 28, 1942 in Poughkeepsie, NY. Reared by her Maternal Aunt, Lendora L. Pittman, Delores accepted the Lord at an early age and was baptized at the Beulah Baptist Church, Poughkeepsie, NY. Upon the completion her primary education in Poughkeepsie, NY, Delores desired to spend time with her Mother and relocated to Whitakers, NC where she attended, completed and received her High School Diploma in 1961 at Phillips High School, Battleboro, NC.

In 1960 **Delores** gave birth to her one and only son, Carlton Cortez Howington and shortly thereafter, married the love of her life, Sergeant Charles Howington of Whitakers, NC. While during his Military Tour, Delores traveled with her husband throughout the country on his assignments. While stationed in Tennessee, Delores met and befriended, Ms. Wilma Rudolph who later would become US Gold Olympic Medalist.

Delores would eventually return to Poughkeepsie, NY, however, she would later migrate to Newark, New Jersey with her Aunt, Carrie Macon Tucker, where she would unite with the True Fellowship Baptist Church, Newark, NJ. Delores successfully gained employment with Remco Deluxe Toy Company, later with Kay's Manufacturing and finally with Jersey Plastic Company until her retirement.

An avid lover of the outdoors, **Delores** met and later remarried an outdoorsman, Mr. Grover Eugene Boothe of New Rochelle, NY. In addition to her outdoor enjoyment and experiences, Delores was fond of the West Indian cultural and enjoyed spending time preparing scrumptious meals.

In later years as her health began to fail, **Delores'** beloved cousin, Mr. Jerald Williams would assist Carlton with the care of his mother.

On Tuesday, February 10, 2015, **Delores** quietly transitioned, joining her parents, her beloved husband, Mr. Grover Eugene Boothe, her brother, George Carlisle and Aunt Carrie Macon Tucker, who all preceded her in death.
