Lois Stern was born on July 21, 1925 in Eufaula, Alabama to Lee Daniels and Augusta Hall. She was educated in Alabama and remained there until she met and married Willie Stern. They moved to Columbus, GA after Willie accepted a job at the Army base in Ft. Benning, GA, where they settled until 1947.

Lois gave her life to Christ at a very young age and in search for a better life, they moved to New York City and found a church home at Powerhouse COGIC under the leadership of Elder Thomas Johnson. She remained at Powerhouse until her husband opened his church, Little Rock COGIC in 1954. She worked faithfully as a first lady and in many other areas of service including choir director, church cook, organizer of bus rides and she formed the Rock Specials a group made up of family members.

Lois Stern always enjoyed her church and family life, however after years as a stay at home Mom she decided to return to school and earned her credentials to become a Nurses Assistant. She worked at the then Pelham Bay General Hospital in the Bronx for 25 years. Even after she began working she was always available to care for her grandchildren whom she loved dearly. She was very close to them and loved babysitting, taking them to church, amusement parks and other entertainment. They will sorely miss her.

Many years later she moved her membership to Saint Samuel COGIC under the leadership of Elder James Johnson. After the passing of Elder James Johnson, Elder Amos Kemper was voted as Pastor. She worked under his leadership until it became difficult for her to travel to Manhattan. She then joined Fellowship COGIC in the Bronx under the leadership of Elder Jay Gooding in 2003. A year later she became the Sunday School Superindent and became a licensed deaconess missionary in 2006. Her dedication to her church life was her passion and her joy, she was a teacher at heart and loved educating new comers to Christ. She continued to work in the Church while enjoying her retirement.

She had two children that preceded her in death: Maisie Stern and James Stern. She leaves to cherish her memory: one sister, Annie Maud Lockman; three children, Cynthia Stern, Carol Stern-Willis and Davene Stern; one son-in-law, Lindsey Willis; thirteen grandchildren, Warren, Rhonda, Chante, Dexter, Nathaniel, Tyese, Ayana, Carlonda, LeMoin, Christopher, Kalilah, Amanze and Franz; twenty great-grandchildren, five great-grandchildren, several nieces, nephews, friends and loved ones.
