Harold Farrington was born in New York, New York, on May 12, 1933 to the late Robena Roberts and the late Harold Farrington.

The second of three siblings, Harold grew up in Harlem, NY, and graduated from Haaren High School. Early in his life, he had musical aspirations to become a drummer, which he pursued. He played the drums recreationally for many years.

In the late 1960's, he met the late Delores Stevenson and her young daughter, Sonji. They built a life as a family, and were together for over 20 years. Always, the hard worker, Harold was a loving provider, partner and father.

Harold was a spiritual man with a strong faith in God. He was initiated as a Yoruba priest into the mysteries of Obatala on October 19, 1985, by Babalorisa Christopher Oliana, priest of Aganju. Upon initiation, he received the name Ade Ekun ("crown of the leopard"), and spent much of the rest of his life studying the Yoruba history and traditions, strengthening his own spiritual foundation and knowledge, and counseling close family members and friends.

Harold believed in education and giving back to his community. He was an active senior. He spent many hours in his retirement volunteering as a tutor to elementary school children in Yonkers, New York. He was also a volunteer for the Family Services Society of Yonkers. Harold also regularly enjoyed classes in tai-chi and dance.

Harold is survived by: his sister, Elyce Roberts; his daughter, Sonji Patrick; his nieces, Brenda McGriff, Iqbal Farrington, and Ajike Kendrick; his cousin, Preston Johnson; son-in-law, William Patrick; two granddaughters; and a host of friends and loved ones who will miss him dearly.
