He loved baseball and enjoyed talking about the NY Mets and NY Yankees. His nieces, Jettie and Gail remembers his visits to Brooklyn every weekend. Gail recalls how "Uncle George" would come with two shopping bags in each hand filled with fruits and other groceries. She and her cousins looked forward to his visits and that 25 cents or 50 cents he would lovingly give them. His nephew, Bruce and wife, Robin always called him to see how "Uncle George" was doing.

On Wednesday, afternoon, February 25, 2015 George went to "sleep". (John 11:11) George is the last of his brothers and sisters to pass away. Those deceased are his five brothers: James, Joseph, Willie, Benjamin and John (Tab) and five sisters: Janie, Leonora (Aunt Lee), Mary, Annie and Lula Byrd.

He is survived by: his devoted son, George A. Franklin, Jr. and daughter-in-law, Lois; two loving grandsons and their wives, George Jason and Monique, Seth Matthew and Fitema Ashaki; two great grandchildren, Jordan and Sanaa, and a host of nephews, nieces, and other relatives and friends.
