Ida Mae Robinson was born on April 11, 1917 in Albany, Georgia, the fourth child of sixteen born to the late Robert Thrower, Sr. and Frances Nelson Thrower. She came to New Jersey in the late 1940s and lived in Roselle for over 70 years.

Ida was a Presser for Towne Cleaners in Roselle for many years.

She was a member of First Baptist Church in Linden for many years where she served on the Flower Club and Missionary Board. On August 22, 1999, Ida was awarded a plaque from the Women Ministry of First Baptist Church for her "Sincere Commitment and Dedication."

Ida was known to be a good "cook" and made awesome sweet potato pies and caramel cakes. She was a very outgoing person and would often invite family and friends to eat together. She also enjoyed caring for her beautiful house plants and flowers.

On Thursday, March 5, 2015, Ida Mae Robinson received her angel wings at the tender age of ninety-seven.

Ida was predeceased by her husband, Dennis Robinson, Jr. on December 1981 and 15 siblings.

She leaves to cherish her memory, her special devoted niece, Marie T. Graham of Edison, New Jersey; god daughter, Lynor Sumner of Arlington, Texas, and a host of nieces, nephews, great-nieces, great-nephews and dear friends.
