Reflections of Life

Having lived a full and fruitful life of 82 years, **William James Massie Sr.** was received into the arms of our Lord on March 2, 2015 at Beth Israel Hospital, Newark, NJ.

William James Massie, Sr. affectionately known as "Pierre" aka "Pops" was born on March 3, 1932 in Jersey City, New Jersey, to the late Royal Pleasant Massie Sr. and Marian Victoria Mann Massie.

He was educated in the Jersey City public school system. At the age of 18 he enlisted for four years in the United States Air force, stationed at Parks Air Force Base, in California, where he served in the 24th Motor Vehicle Squad, APO 74, in which he received a National Defense Service Medal.

He extended his act of kindness by helping others in need. He was well respected by his family and the people in his community. William Massie became a member of the International Mason and Eastern Star organization. He retired after obtaining his 33rd degree.

In 1971, William joined Christ Memorial Holiness Church, Newark, NJ, under the leadership of the late Bishop Edward Lawrence Hackett and Mother Anne Hackett of Newark, NJ in which he accepted Christ as his Lord and personal Savior.
