Reflections of Life

Life began, on June 18, 1928 in the city of Warrenton, NC to parents, Mary Frances Algood and Frank Moore, Sr. It was through them that **Mary Ellen** was born. She was one of eight children of the Moore clan.

Mary grew up in Warrenton, where she attended grade and high school. She later became a part of the Great Migration north where her life's journey took root. Her first stop, landed her in the state of New Jersey. After a brief spell in the city of Englewood, Mary moved to Hackensack around 1946. It was where she met and married her predeceased husband, Samuel P. Johnson.

Mary and Samuel took their final move to Paterson, New Jersey in the mid 50's. It was there, that the couple settled and began their new lives as one. Mary gave birth to her only daughter, Theresa LaVerne Johnson. The couple joined the Community Baptist Church under the pastorship of the Rev. Frederick LaGarde, Sr. where she and her husband became active members on the Board of Trustees.

During 1960's, Mary and her husband was motivated and concerned about the quality of life issues that many Black Americans faced. She took that famous ride as a freedom rider, to the March on Washington in 1963 with a determination in mind to end the injustices, and to dismantle the Jim Crow laws addressing the inequalities concerning Black American people, as well as all people. "We weren't taking it anymore!"

In 1966, Mary became a widow faced with the daunting task of raising her daughter alone. Mary joined the Freedom Fighters and became active in the city of Paterson. It was during that time, as one of few trustees aided and assisted the pastor in bringing Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. into the city.

She was one of the charter members of the Paterson chapter of the NAACP, an Eastern Star, A Life Time Member of the National Negro Women Council, one of the original organizers of the National Negro Women Council, one of the original organizer of the African American Parade, 100 Black Women Plus, a member of PCAAW at church a member of place of reconciliation support group and a County Committee Leader for the first ward. Mary's passion as an organizer, innovator, worked tirelessly to improve the quality of life for all people. She sought donations to help mothers that were incarcerated to assist in providing toys and clothing for their children.

Her final chapter, she leaves to mourn a daughter, Theresa Johnson; a step daughter, Hilda McGuire; granddaughter, Chasmine Johnson Petersen; step granddaughter, Lynette McGuire Butler; step grandson, Darryl Thompson; great granddaughter, Audrina Rose Vaccaro; and a host of nieces, nephews, cousins and friends. Mary leaves a legacy amongst those who she holds dearly! "I'll be alright, don't you worry about me" "You must keep moving forward, with the intent to uplift and help others" she would say. The victory of living a life well lived is not by the things one acquired, but by the stewardship of kindness that actually do transforms lives.
