While in Grand Cayman, Carlie worked at the Wholesome Bakery as a baker.

Carlie returned to Jamaica in 1987. He worked at Food & Nutrition in 1989 as a baker. In 1991, he worked at the American Embassy as a security officer.

In 1994, Carlie migrated to the United States of America, where he resided with his niece, Janet Thompson in Bronx, New York.

Carlie was a very hard working man, a former Jamaican Custom Officer and was employed by the Embassy of Jamaica.

Upon his migration to the USA he was employed as a Special Security Officer where he got his alias "Security". Frederic was baptized and confirmed at The Great Vigil of Easter on April 23, 2011 at Redeemer Evangelical Lutheran Church in the Bronx, New York. He had a special love for sports. His favorite was cricket and baseball. He was a "Color Red" Boys Town Club fraternity member. He started his cricket umpiring in Jamaica and when he migrated to the USA he continued umpiring in the New York Cricket and Metropolitan League. He was also a notable cricket and baseball historian who could give you all the scores and facts from way back when.
