Mrs. Ada Sorriah Callwood-Jackson was born November 28, 1922 and departed April 1, 2015. She was born at St. Thomas, United States Virgin Islands.

She was the daughter of William and Theodora Seely-Callwood. She left St Thomas during the late 1940's. She was a longtime resident of New York City and was employed at New York-Cornell Hospital for over twenty-five years. She also continued her spirituality at Christ Episcopal Church on Main Street. Sometimes she walked or was picked up by MS. Karen. Ada continued walking around East Orange until illness came calling. She lived at Brookhaven until it was time to go home.

Preceded in death by her parents, three sisters, two brothers.






