





<u>Obituary</u>

Howard Franklin Broadnax was born June 27. 1953 in Orangeburg, SC. He transitioned from his earthly home to his heavenly home on Good Friday, April 3, 2015. Howard gave his life to Christ at the age of twelve at St. Paul Baptist Church and began school at Riverside Elementary in Orangebur. He graduated from Wilkerson High School and briefly attended South Carolina State University. In 1976, Howard joined the United States Army and was a paratrooper stationed at Ft. Bragg, NC. He met and married Gladys Baker and from that union one son, Rodriguez was born. Howard later marred Myra Goodyear and became the step-father to three other children, Keion, Angel and Carla, whom he loved as his own. Howard was a hard-working man who always gave 100% to any job he had. He played just as hard as he worked and enjoyed fishing, shooting pool, singing old school tunes and watching old TV shows like Gunsmoke and Perry mason. But most of all he loved being a big brother, father and uncle. For some reason, he wanted people to see him as being "hard", but everyone who knew him, knew that he had a heart of gold and would give the very shirt off his back to those in need. Even though he often had barely enough to sustain himself, he felt he was blessed and graciously shared his blessings, by feeding and even providing a roof over the heads of people he knew and less than him. If you were lucky enough to have him as a friend you know he was a loyal friend to the end. He was loved by his neighbors and he loved his community. He assisted the elderly and mentored the young, often using the mistakes made in his own life as an example of what not to do. He would spend hours sharing stories from the Bible that he had learned as a young child from his grandmother. Howard's big heart and bright

smile will be greatly missed by the many lives he touched, but his legacy will live on.

Howard was preceded in death by his parents, George and Edith Broadnax, Sr.
