

Charles B. Thomas, Jr., was born on January 22, 1930 in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania to the proud parents of the late Charles and Pansy Mason-Thomas. He lived and received his education in Accomac, Virginia until adulthood where he then relocated to Paterson, New Jersey in 1948.

Charles served in the US Army for a short period where he was Honorably Discharged in 1951. He worked as a Traffic Manager, Truck Driver and Taxi Cab Driver for over thirty years and most recently as a courier for transactions with Division of Motor Vehicles.

Charles was a member of New A.M.E. Zion Church for many years where he served on several organizations as well as the Executive Board. He was a member of the Virginia-based Mary N. Smith Alumni Association where he held the position of treasurer since its inception in 1998. Charles' pride and joy was serving as a Cub Scout Master for "Pack 842" of Paterson and he was very active in the Boy Scouts of America.

For his dedication to young people, he was awarded the Whitney M. Young Service Award, which was presented to him by New Jersey Senator, John A. Girgenti. Charles was a member of St. Paul Lodge No. 7 of Hackensack, New Jersey since 1981. He held the position of Most Excellent High Priest and Treasurer. He was a 32° Mason and a Shriner.

Charles was married to the late Susan Alexander Thomas who predeceased him in June of 1993.
