In Remembrance

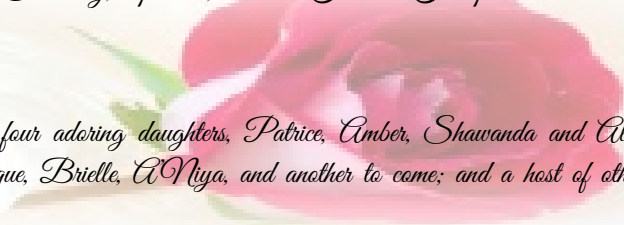
